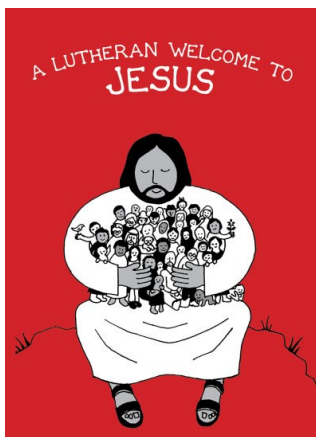
Pastor Hagerty writes...

Church Council Minutes

June 15, 2025

Called to order in the Parish Hall by President Don Hill at 11:18 am.

Opening Prayer by Pastor Hagerty

Pastor's Report

We continue to provide weekly worship resources to the congregation. They include:

1. In-person worship services are held at 10:00 am on Sundays.
2. YouTube worship videos are filmed and edited by Emory Bedenbaugh. Through June 15th, we have done 243 videos.
3. On-line bulletins and sermon transcripts in pdf format are emailed to the church family and hand-delivered to 22 household locations.

Worship video links are being emailed to our church family and posted on our website of: www.stthomaschapin.com. They are also posted to our St. Thomas Facebook page and boosted to the Chapin area.

We offered Holy Communion by intinction on Sunday, June 1st. We cancelled worship due to a power outage on June 8th, the Day of Pentecost. We had Holy Communion at the altar rail on the festival Sunday of The Holy Trinity on June 15th. Our in-person worship attendance for May was 60. We averaged 48 views per week on YouTube for our pre-recorded Sunday worship videos.

Other activities include:

1. Confirmation class and Sunday School classes are taking a ten (10) week break for the summer after May 25th. We will resume classes on Sunday, August 10th. In the meantime, Pastor is offering a Tuesday Bible Study:” How Lutherans Interpret the Bible.”

2. Our Young at Heart (YAH) seniors’ group will meet this Tuesday, June 17th for good food and fellowship. A meal will be provided along with BINGO.

3. Pastor and Tracey Hagerty attended the SC Synod Assembly in North Charleston on June 12th to the 14th. Andrew Boozer was elected Vice President of the SC Synod for a six-year term. He will chair Synod Council meetings. More information will follow in the next Pastor’s Report.

4. The 2025 Dutch Fork Cluster Beach Retreat at the Isle of Palms Coastal Retreat Center will take place June 19th to June 22nd. We currently have twelve (12) rooms reserved and twenty-seven (27) people are planning to attend. This includes twenty (20) adults and seven (7) children. We are partnering with churches in the Dutch Fork Cluster and will have attendees from five (5) different Lutheran churches. Our devotional theme will focus on the resource: “A Lutheran Welcome to Jesus” by Daniel Erlander.

5. We are working with Bethel Lutheran Church to provide a Vacation Bible School from July 20th through the 24th at St Thomas using the “Road Trip” curriculum. Each day will start with a meal at 5:30 pm and the program will be from 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm. We have secured the Rev. Dr. Bobby Morris to be our speaker for our VBS adult class on the first two evenings. More information to follow. We are planning to have a youth class.

6. Pastor and Elizabeth Hill began using the Church Fuel resource on Thursday, May 15th. Our first priority with Church Fuel is to get their assistance with purpose and mission statements using their two-page plan and coaching. Our second priority may be learning how to use Google Ads, which can be free to non-profits and could help our VBS advertising.

Church Fuel – Two Page Plan

Elizabeth presented the Two Page Plan resource from Church Fuel. We have all heard the phrase: “We want to all be on the same page.” Similarly, our Church Fuel consultants have a two-page plan resource. It helps churches get organized and come up with vision and mission statements. We certainly want to be focused and headed in the right direction.

We have recently been talking about purpose and mission. The purpose is the “why” - Why do we exist as a church? It is rooted in scripture, which already exists and inspires us. So, we do not have to come up with a purpose from scratch. It should be simple and what we can all agree on. The mission is the “what.” What are we doing to keep us moving in the right direction? What is the goal? It should be able to be measured. Example: “We will have three pancake suppers in the next three months.” What is our current audience? What should our target audience be? When you agree on your target audience, it can help you develop your mission and goals, which is then pointing toward your purpose. We will get more and more people involved from our council and ministry leaders. More to come.

Treasurer's Reports

The Consolidated Fund Activity Report shows that we ended the month of May with a current operating fund balance of **\$82,368.57**. Our current operating fund expenses during the month of May were **\$16,653.35**. Our May receipts were **\$26,879.32**. We are still off to a very good start after the first five (5) months of 2025.

The May 2025 consolidated activity report includes the following designated fund totals:

Capital improvement fund: **\$37,359.39**
(contains **\$30,485 of the roof replacement funds**)

Sanctuary enhancements fund: **\$20,584.58**

Cemetery fund: **\$322.07**

Social Ministry / Outreach Fund: **\$656.37**

STLC Youth Fund: **\$3,442.28**

JLB Endowment Principal Balance: **\$83,674.39**

JLB Endowment Interest Balance: **\$27,553.94**

JLB Loan Balance: **\$24,910.63**

Discussion took place to distinguish between designated funds and budget line items.

Our treasurer's reports show how we are doing with each budgeted line item, and compare the pro-rated budgeted amounts with actual expense totals. This is done on a monthly basis.

Stewardship and Finance Committee

A Stewardship and Finance meeting was held on 5 June. Topics discussed include the following:

1. Clean up of dormant Church Windows line items – On-going discussion. We will follow-up with Jennifer regarding

her thoughts on consolidation and/or removal of line items (note – similar clean-up was conducted several years ago)

2. WELCA Account – decision made to proceed with WELCA account consolidation within Church Windows; specific line items for WELCA needs and be-reavement expenses will be maintained...budgeting for both lines will be based on annual needs against line-item balance
3. Supervisory chain of command for salaried employees – will formalize direct line reporting to the chairman of the associated committee (unless specified otherwise), with dotted line reporting to the Executive Committee; allows for employees to discuss their job function, expectations and roles and responsibilities with associated committee chair, with Executive Committee supporting chair and employee as needed; example reporting chains include: Pastor would report to Executive Committee; Ginny would report to chair of Worship and Music Committee; Sharon would report to Pastor; Jennifer would report to the chair of Stewardship and Finance Committee
4. Follow-up with Capital Campaign – given success of roof campaign, no plans to continue a capital campaign at this time.

Cemetery

Christy reported that the cemetery constitution was passed and council all got the updated version. The plaque for the back of the memorial wall has arrived and will be installed. It has the names of people whose memorial contributions were used to fund

the columbarium. A meeting is scheduled with Anne Shealy, Christy, Susan Waites, Janet Tapp, and Ricky Waites to discuss next steps in creating a scatter garden.

Christian Education

Beth gave an oral report. Pastor already covered VBS, A meeting will be scheduled for mid-July to plan our fall Christian Ed offerings. Beth said that early August is when school starts, so she would like to plan a get-together of Sunday School people before they go off to their first class.

Property Committee

1. Premiere Roofing has scheduled the new roof install for 6/23-6-27/25. The Property Committee recommends Cobblestone Gray as the shingle color.
2. Replaced the batteries in the smoke detectors in Fellowship Hall. Seeking Bids for the soft wash of the Church and Fellowship Hall.
3. We are in contact with Duffie Driveway Solutions (this is the company that did the concrete work for the Columbarium and sidewalk last year) for a quote to re-point the mortar between the steps of the Church. More to follow.
4. Plan a meeting in August- September to discuss next major project.

Outreach and Evangelism

Our committee met June 12th. Those present were Susan Waites, Christy Brasington, and Gale Smith. Elizabeth Hill joined us for a presentation on "Building Dynamic Ministries." She will present it at council on June 15th. Christy updated our visitation list. Judy could not make the meeting but submitted some info. More to come regarding the

AED that we will purchase. A reminder of the Self Defense class will be July 26th from 9 am to 1 pm. More to come on the Yoga class. More to come for obtaining a board to be used in the in the narthex for sign-up lists. Movie night will move to fall. Next meeting to be announced.

Children's and Youth Ministry

Don reported that our youth did a great job as crucifer and acolyte today. The youth continue to support our worship services. Upcoming opportunities for youth are GraceWorks on July 13-18 and Vacation Bible School on July 20th – 24th.

Worship and Music

Pastor will be at the Beach Retreat on June 22nd and the Rev. Dr. Linda Anderson will be our supply preacher. The adult choir will be off for the month of July. Our last anthem will be sung on June 29th. Our next choir practice will be on July 28th.

New Business

1. WELCA met and is planning Home coming. Seminarian Zachary Lindler will preach. The theme will be college football tailgating. Our mission is to collect food and supplies for We Care and invite members who have been infrequently at worship. WELCA will organize the fellowship lunch and the worship will be organized by the Worship and Music Committee.
2. Christy suggested that copies of the updated and approved cemetery constitution be made available in the narthex. All agreed. Pastor concluded the meeting with prayer, including the Lord's Prayer at 12:10 pm.

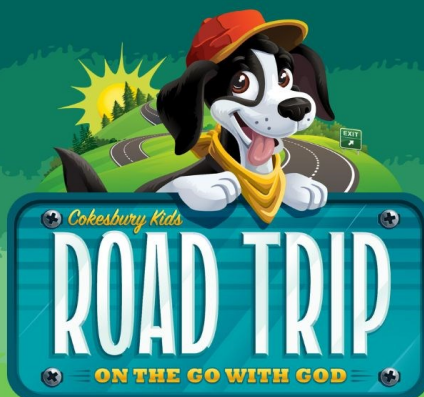

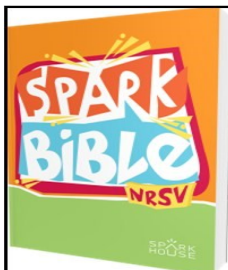
